PREFACE

This issue of the «Archives Italiennes de Biologie» is dedicated to Ermanno Manni, Professor of Human Physiology at the Medical School of the Catholic University in Rome, in occasion of his seventieth anniversary. This initiative was made possible by the cooperation of all his students, colleagues and friends, who readily accepted the proposal to give him a tangible demonstration of their esteem, respect and affection.
